

Reimagining Your Public Library

The Project to Build a New Public Library for Junction City/ Geary County/Fort Riley

Dorothy Bramlage Public Library is both a community and a regional hub. An updated facility will open the door for the public to utilize modern spaces and technology for meetings, classes, studying, and other programming. In addition, the library provides the region with research and technology assistance as well as community information and more.

The new library will be located on the south east corner of the site of the former Junction City High School complex at approximately 1120 West 8th Street where the Deever Building once stood.



The proposed 30,000 square foot, energy efficient facility will provide additional shelving and meeting space for the public as well as additional office and work space for staff.
