Adult Winter Reading

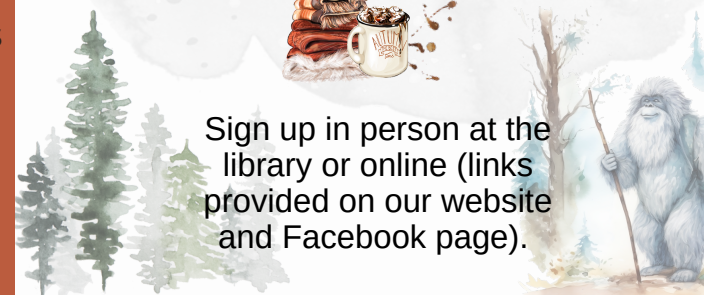


December 14, 2023-February 8, 2024
